

The congress will take place on the premises of the Council of Europe. Official languages used will be English and French. Registration will start as from 8:30 am on the 15th of September 2005. Please note that it is of utmost importance to be present as early as possible, as from 8 am due to security checks on entering the Council of Europe building. Identity card or passport will be required.



Lunch will be taken at the Deputies' restaurant at the European parliament. The two buildings are connected by a footbridge.



On the eve of the Congress, Wednesday 14th of September at 6:30 pm, we will be the guests of Mrs Fabienne KELLER, Strasbourg Mayor, at a reception given at the Town Hall, place Broglie. We regret to inform you that only the first 150 registered Congress participants will have access to this special event: so, please do not forget to register. The reception will be followed by an Organ Concert at the Strasbourg Cathedral at 8:30 pm.

On Thursday 15th of September at the closing of afternoon sessions, you are cordially invited to join the town centre by river boat for a pleasure trip on the famous city's canals. In the evening, the Conference dinner will take place at 8:30 pm at the restaurant « Côté Lac », special buses from the town centre will be available to get to the restaurant and back. May we attract your attention to the fact that there is a limited number of places available and as a result, it is compulsory to register as soon as possible.



**Actual security measures:** Please note that no luggage is allowed within the Council of Europe's premises and you have to wear the badge that will be given to you on entering the Council of Europe's premises. The same rules apply when entering the European Parliament building and the Town Hall.

### HOW TO GET TO STRASBOURG?



#### By air

Strasbourg International Airport is only 15 km (10 miles) away from the Congress Centre, with direct access by the A35 motorway. There are regular and charter flights to most airports in France and Europe.

Frankfurt Airport is only 200 km (132 miles) away from the Congress Centre. There are regular and charter flights to and from most airports in Europe and Worldwide. From here you would need to take the Airport Shuttle to the city centre (6 per day from Monday to Sunday).

#### By train

The Train Station is only 5 minutes away from the Congress Centre. There are direct links with Paris (3hrs 50min), Lyon (4hrs 30min), Brussels (5hrs 20min), Frankfurt (2hrs 30min), Basel (1hr 30min) and Zurich (3 hrs).



#### By motorway

Motorway access is only 200 meters away from the Congress Centre  
To the North and the West: Paris 455 km, Luxemburg 220 km, Amsterdam and Brussels.  
To the South: Mulhouse, Lyon, Marseille, Geneva and Basel.  
To the East: Hamburg, Frankfurt, Basel and Milan.

#### Public transport in town

Every 15 minutes, an airport shuttle brings you to the nearest tramway station (Baggersee) which is only at 15 min away from the city centre.

Tel numbers for taxis: +33 388 361313. Taxi price from the city centre to the Council of Europe is approximately 10-15 €. You are advised to order your taxi 45 min before the beginning of the congress

**Tram and bus:** Strasbourg's public transportation system has 4 tramway lines which serve the city. The tram runs daily from 04.30am to 00.30am.
